One of the things we are encouraged to do during the season of Lent is to increase our prayer life – increase the time we spend talking to God. We can thank him for the blessings he gives us or ask him for special help with some of our needs. We can advocate for our nation or community or individuals we may know who are struggling. We can ask for his guidance in the ministries and life of the church and our work in the world. We can ask him for protection, healing, patience, relief, forgiveness, or simply his love.

Prayer does not have to be poetic or deeply theological or even organized. Prayer is simply a conversation with God: simple, fragmented, heartfelt. It can take place in church, at home, in the car, at the gym. We can pray in the morning, at mealtimes, at bedtime, or whenever we have a free moment. Prayer can last for a few minutes or just a few seconds. We may start a prayer and get interrupted and go back to the prayer later. It's all OK. God will figure it out. Remember, God doesn't need long prayers. He just wants to be in conversation with us.

But some of us are just not confident in our abilities to pray. Just do it. Just talk. But, if you want to use some written prayers. I am going to share some with you from Martin Luther. Each one of these is part of my daily devotions and address particular times of the day.

Luther's Morning Prayer

I thank you my heavenly father, through Jesus Christ your dear Son, that you have protected me through the night from all harm and danger. I ask that you would also protect me today from sin and all evil, so that my life and actions may please you. Into your hands I commend myself: my body, my soul, and all that is mine. Let your holy angels be with me, so that the wicked foe may have no power over me. Amen.

Luther's Noon Time Prayer

Gracious God, you protect us like a mother and nurture us like a father. Grant that at this midday, we would be protected from evil, that our actions would bring justice to the poor and downtrodden, and that we would serve you in perfect joy for the sake of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Luther's Evening Prayer

I thank you, Heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ your dear Son, that you graciously protected me today. I ask you to forgive me all my sins where I have done wrong, and to protect me through the night. For into your hands, I commend myself: my body, my soul, and all that is mine. Let your holy angels be with me, so that the wicked foe may have no power over me. Amen.

If you ever get stuck and simply do not know what to pray, The Lord's Prayer is always appropriate. I hope you find time to be in more conversation with God during this Lenten Season and throughout your life. God bless you and keep you in His care.

In Memoriam

Robert Pendi

November 8, 1936 – March 4, 2025



Bob Pendi, 88, of Exeter Township entered eternal rest on Tuesday, March 4, 2025. Born in Birdsboro, PA on November 8, 1936, he was the son of the late Santo J. Pendi and Sandine M. (Madeira) Pendi.

A graduate of Birdsboro High School, class of 1955, Bob enlisted in the U.S.

Coast Guard, serving his country with dedication until his honorable discharge in 1963. Bob later built a career as a distribution designer, first with Met-Ed for a decade and then with GTE (now Verizon) for 20 years until his well-earned retirement in April 1998.

A man of faith, he was a member of Schwarzwald Lutheran Church. Bob's spirit will be carried on by his devoted wife of 37 years, Jean M. (Trostle) Pendi. Social Ministry Committee News and Notes April 2025 Edition

This month, we will be highlighting the Hope Rescue Mission of Reading and its various programs. Founded in 1894, the mission has been a place of refuge for men, women, and children who have experienced homelessness. The goal of the mission is to assist people as they transition back into the community as productive and independent citizens.

The Men's Center provides "the physical, emotional and spiritual needs of the homeless of Berks County to share the life-changing message of the Gospel with the HOPE of seeing them restored to a productive life." This care is supported by case managers in order to meet the needs, including mental health, addiction, legal and financial struggles, of each individual.

The LightHouse opened its doors in July, 2023. This center provides temporary housing for single women and women and their children who have experienced homelessness, as well as an emergency shelter where guests may stay from 1 to 3 nights. The guests are offered spiritual guidance and supportive services for medical and/or behavioral health concerns, education, employment, government assistance, and housing search procedures.

HopeThrift is the name of the clothing collection program run by the Hope Rescue Mission. Donations are sorted by volunteers and then made available to the guests from the Men's Center and The LightHouse.

During the month of April, the Social Ministry Committee will be sponsoring a clothing drive for the Hope Rescue Mission. The collection will run from April 1 through April 30. You will find a labeled bin in the Narthex to place your bags of **clean, gently used** items. Donations of toiletries, such as razors, deodorant, and new underwear for men, would also be appreciated.

Sometimes, during the season of Lent, people give up something, a food or habit, etc. in order to focus more on the true meaning of the season. A pastor once preached that we can also "take on" behaviors that can become positive habits in the future. Whatever you choose to make Lent meaningful, thinking of others is always a good place to start.

Thank you for considering being part of this clothing drive. Your donations could help change a life for the better.

Designated Pastor's Report

Submitted written report with key dates. One week of his vacation is a floater week. Mission trip – 17⁺ are attending – 14 from St. Mark's, 1 from SLC, and 2 or 3 from Reformation. St. Mark's will pay for the van rental up front, and then we need to reimburse for our share. There are 5 adults going, so we have a good adult-to-kid ratio. All adults will have their clearances.

Met with SLC's Worship and Music Committee. We would like to have a joint outdoor service, with SLC and St. Mark's at Daniel Boone Homestead followed by a cookout. We would also like to have a joint choir/praise band music exchange at some point.

Youth service day is May 10 (this was subsequently changed to May 3) -- a helping harvest day to work on requirements for confirmation.

Kathy Snyder from SLC will be away for the summer, so St. Mark's organist will supply for SLC summer services.

Treasurer's Report

The Finance/Stewardship Committee approved 1) the January disbursements, and 2) the CD renewals with Diamond FCU, Member's First, JPMorgan and Edward Jones. They approve any of those four institutions for our investments.

Any investment documents would require the Treasurer's signature and any two signatures of the remaining three officers.
