On March 5th, we celebrate Ash Wednesday - the day we begin our season of Lent. We will have service at 7:00 PM and will also offer Ashes-To-Go on the front parking lot from 2:00-3:00 PM. I hope you will join us as we begin our journey into Lent. Throughout the season, we will have the Lenten *Holden Evening Prayer Service* each Wednesday beginning at 7:00 PM. I hope you will join us.

So, what is Lent? Lent is the season of preparation leading up to Easter. It commemorates the forty days that Jesus spent in the wilderness being tempted by Satan. We use these forty days to contemplate our relationship with Christ and the call that He has for each of us. People celebrate Lent with different practices: fasting, prayer, self-denial, and almsgiving. Fasting could include giving up certain foods or luxuries for the season - maybe giving up meat, sweets, or alcohol. Increase your prayer life - start your day or end your day with prayer. Our country, our community, and our church can certainly use your prayers. Pray for yourself or pray for your neighbors.

Self-denial could include giving up certain activities or luxuries, or maybe favorite hobbies for the season, And Almsgiving is all about living a generous life. But, be especially generous during Lent - maybe give to the church's LENTEN SELF-DENIAL CAMPAIGN or increase your offerings during the season. You will find special Lenten Self-Denial Envelopes in the Narthex and Vestibule entrances. Please use these envelopes to add a special and additional offering to your normal weekly or monthly offerings. This year, the Lenten Self-Denial Offering will go to support the Veteran's Stand Down in Pottstown. The Stand Down supports homeless veterans and veterans in need in the Pottstown area. Veterans receive hot food at the stand down and can participate in a special clothing closet and food pantry just for Vets. They also can talk to providers for services and benefits and spend some fellowship time with fellow vets.

#### Call Update

#### Pastor Jim Farnsworth

Pastor Jim has now served as our designated Pastor for just over a year. He has been very supportive in all areas. We are thankful for his dedication to us.

The Synod has made it very clear that there just are not any candidates available for us to interview and has stated that with so many vacancies, Pastors can pick and choose where they would like to go. Berks County is not a preferred location and there are far more openings than there are Pastors to fill them.

The Synod is asking us to "think outside the box" and to explore different options for our vacancy. We have been working towards this goal.

At our January Church Council meeting, an idea was presented that was unanimously approved. The details are as follows:

Pastor Jim remains in his position as our Designated Pastor, adding our weekly services to his current list of responsibilities, i.e. council meetings; annual meetings; hospital visits/ home visits, as needed; confirmation classes; and other youth opportunities.

Pastor Jim would begin his new responsibilities after Easter on April 27th. This would begin a "trial period" that will continue through 2025. During this time, we will be working on ways that this arrangement could continue on a permanent basis, beginning 2026. A committee consisting of members of Schwarzwald and members of St. Mark's will begin discussions on how best to work together to strengthen both congregations.

Pastor Jim will receive our regular Supply Pastor renumeration for Sunday worship and will continue to receive hourly payment for all other services. Should our arrangement become permanent in 2026, a salary will be determined. Our budget is not impacted by this new arrangement. (we are currently paying a Supply Pastor and a Designated Pastor).

He will be instituting weekly Holy Communion and will supply home baked bread for most services.

We will need to start our services 15 minutes later (10:45a) to give him time to complete his service at St. Mark's and travel to Schwarzwald. It will be necessary to maintain this start time throughout the summer.

Our call will remain open throughout this trial period. If a Pastoral candidate comes forward, we will interview and evaluate that individual.

Our Call listing will be adapted to include a search for a part-time Pastor that can cover the worship services that Pastor Jim cannot; that can do some visitation and possibly do some additional work with our youth and families. This would be needed for 2026.

We are excited and filled with positiveness as we begin this faith journey. We ask for your patience and support in the months ahead. Please do not hesitate to reach out with questions.

The Social Ministry Committee is always impressed and appreciative of the generosity and support it receives from our Schwarzwald Family. You put your trust in us to choose organizations that work toward the betterment of others and that have a real impact on peoples' lives.

This year, we will be using the monthly issues of the "Pulpit and Pew" to better acquaint you with these organizations and charities. We plan to share the various groups' mission statements and purposes so that you can feel comfortable that we are supporting worthwhile causes. With that being said, let us focus on the New Journey Soup Kitchen.

The New Journey Soup Kitchen is part of New Journey Outreach, Inc., which was established in 2014. The latter's mission states, "With our committed volunteers and generous donors, we at NJCO restore hope, comfort, and dignity by feeding, clothing, and supporting those in need in the Reading, PA community".

Schwarzwald supports this mission with our Soup Team Ministry. Each month has an assigned soup, pasta or barbeque meal. The Soup Team members who volunteer to cook for a specific month or months, are given their month's recipe so they can prepare their assigned meal at home. The meal containers are placed in the large freezer in Schwarzwald's kitchen and transported by volunteers to New Journey.

If you would like to become a Soup Team volunteer, please speak to a Social Ministry Committee member. It's a great way to share with our community!

Thank you for your continued support of the **Little Free Pantry**. Due to your generosity, the pantry box has been filled throughout our cold winter days. The collection box for food may be found in the Narthex. Suitable cold-weather items include:

Boxes of cereal (very welcomed) Ramen Noodles, Pasta,
Dried Beans, Rice, Crackers, Dried Fruit, Nuts,
Ready-to-make meals, Mac and Cheese, Packets of Oatmeal

The ideal temperature for storing canned food is between 50°F and 70°F. Currently, we are not placing canned goods in the pantry, however, if donated, these items will be saved for future use.

#### COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS (January)

#### Treasurer's Report -- Scot Griesemer

November and December disbursements were approved.

Reviewed the year-end financials.

Reviewed the financials for the Annual Congregational Report. We budget for a Pastor with 10 years of experience for the Pastor's salary and housing allowance. The additional approval that will be in the annual report is the difference between a 10-year and a 20-year pastor. The Proposed Budget will be presented to the congregation at the Annual Congregational Meeting.

#### **Old Business**

Annual Congregational Meeting will be held on January 26, 2025. Mark Bauer will be nominated for council to replace Kelly Kline-Carr. The kids will prepare a spaghetti lunch to serve before the annual meeting.

Council Reorganization - Following the Annual Meeting, there will be a Church Council Reorganizational Meeting held in the Scout Room to elect council officers.

#### New Business

The Church Council meetings for 3/12 and 4/9 will be held immediately following the 7:00 PM Wednesday Evening Lenten Service.

There is an opening on the Fellowship Committee for a committee Chair. There will be a meeting on 2/9 at 9:15 AM in the Coffee Bar to discuss. (This meeting was subsequently changed to February 16 because of the ice storm.)

Discussion on Youth funds available for "Box City" in March and a youth trip in June to Nashville - \$550 /person. There is approximately \$2700 under "Prepaid Mission Trip" and approximately \$2300 in "Youth Fund Raisers." It is suggested a third be paid by the church, a third through fund-raising and a third by the families.

Pastor Jim's Contract - In June, Pastor Bardo will no longer continue with us. He would like to supply through June 8, but cannot commit beyond that. In talking with Pr. Jim, he presented us with an outline. In addition to Pr. Jim's current Designated Pastor duties here at SLC, he would do our weekly worship service. After he was done at the worship service at St. Mark's, he would drive to SLC for our worship service. He would continue to teach Confirmation, attend council meetings, weddings, funerals, and do hospital visitations (but would appreciate home visitations by lay persons). We would need another part-time person for some services, such as Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter and Christmas. Pastor Simmons will do Ash Wednesday this year, and Pr. Bardo will see us through Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter. Pr. Jim would also like full ability for the worship service liturgy, and we must have weekly communion. Additionally, we would need to make a minor adjustment to our start time to 10:45 AM. Pr. Jim is requesting stoles be purchased to keep here at SLC and become the property of SLC. When we go to 10:45 AM, it would be for 52 weeks a year. We would not change the time for the summer. We would be getting another year of consistency. He would receive \$250 for each service plus mileage. Confirmation will still be held here with the St. Mark's kids, and it needs to be extended to 2 hours now and 3 hours in the fall. We will have meetings with St. Mark's council president and our council president along with Pr. Neidig from the Synod office. The goal is to do some service projects together. The two churches will remain independent. This would be on a trial basis through the end of year. As we get to the end of 2025, we will revisit this temporary solution that could become a long-term solution. Our Call Process through the Synod would remain open for all of 2025. We will present this to the congregation at the annual meeting.
